PhD COURSE

The overall aim of the course is to learn and reflect upon multidisciplinary and multi-theoretical research approaches to governance in the context of the High North: What are the implications for Arctic private and public sector?

Learning activities

Scenario workshop, plenary lectures, group and individual presentations, attendance of High North Dialogue conference.
