**Manuscript Publication**

Papers accepted by the organizing committee will be published. All manuscripts will be published as drafted by the author. All manuscripts are expected to address the given topics. Manuscripts that do not follow the proposed format will be rejected. The conference proceedings will be uploaded to the Russian electronic library Elibrary.ru and registered at the database Russian Science Index (РИИИ).

Participants are expected to bear all costs (incl. travel, accommodation, and meal expenses).
